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Offer flexible options

Creating flexible and responsive environments allows students to make choices about:

- ✓ tools and resources they might use (digital and non-digital)
- ✓ methods to share their ideas and understanding
- ✓ subject content
- ✓ how they physically access an environment
- ✓ order of learning tasks
- ✓ when to sit assessments
- ✓ who they might access for help
- ✓ the process to finish or complete a task
- ✓ who they might work and collaborate with.
