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## **Develop buddy systems**

Use buddy systems to promote social skills.

- Buddies are given training on how to help students develop specific skills, such as recreation, social, and communication skills.
- Buddy systems result in personal growth for non-disabled peers.
- To promote high quality interactions, students should also have opportunities to interact in activities that are not always instructional.

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## **Facilitate friendships**

Friendships are an important foundation in an inclusive classroom.

Strategies to create and maintain friendships:

- Identify interests Allow learners to express their interests through discussion, surveys, games, and clubs to help them discover other students who are like-minded.
- Highlight strengths Highlight student strengths to help learners to feel valued and confident amongst their peers.
- Emphasie social skills Embed opportunities to teach social skills through the curriculum, for example: games, problem solving activities, class meetings or discussions.
- Provide opportunities Encourage friendships through social opportunities such as play, group work, class trips or school wide activity days.
